Young Jammers 2018 Scholarship Program Application

Flagstaff Friends of Traditional Music is pleased to offer 6 Young Jammer scholarships to aspiring and deserving young musicians with an interest in studying guitar, banjo, mandolin, ukulele, bass or violin. The applicant must also have an interest in developing his or her musical skills, improvising, and playing music with other musicians. \$300.00 scholarships will be awarded to qualifying students. Former Young Jammers are encouraged to apply. **The application deadline is January 15, 2018.** Students will be accepted into the program based on the following criteria:

Young Jammers are required to commit to attending a minimum of 2 of 3 scheduled jams on the following dates: February 25, April 29 and May 27. The jams will take place at Arizona Music Pro at 2pm. If the student and parents are unable to commit to at least 2 of these scheduled jams, they are requested to forego applying until the next Young Jammers session, which will start in the fall. In addition to attending at least 2 scheduled jams, the student will be required to submit lesson logs - completed by the student and instructor at each lesson - at the completion of their studies, which will be no later than May 31, 2018. These lesson logs will be submitted to FFOTM at one of the addresses below.

Students ranging in age from 8-18 may apply to the program by completing this application form with parental consent, support and oversight. The recipient of a scholarship agrees that he or she will whole-heartedly participate in the program, attend at least 2 scheduled jams and complete 8 lesson logs.

Once selected into the program, participants may choose to study with instructors at either the Flagstaff School of Music (928.268.1108) or Arizona Music Pro (928.556.9054). The scholarship funds will be deposited into an account in the student's name and will be managed by the school of choice. Day, time and length of lessons will be decided by the student and instructor. 8 lessons must be completed by May 31, 2018, with lesson logs also due by that date.

Upon being notified of acceptance, students and parents may then contact their school of choice and schedule lessons. Students in need of a loaner instrument may check out an instrument from FFOTM.
